#### Communication

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- You have already seen initial information on our website.
- We hope further and more specific information will be given at a New Entrants Meeting in September. This may have to be a virtual meeting depending on the Covid guidelines at the time.
- Further guidance on reading will also be given at that meeting.
- We will be sending you a questionnaire to complete regarding your child you will be able to write anything you would like the teacher to know about your child.

#### Communication

- Weekly information, including the school newsletter, 'More News' is provided by email. Daily information is given in the children's diaries.
- Information regarding trips is also made available by email.
- You may telephone/email the school at any time to ask a question.
- You will be invited to a Parent Teacher Consultation during the Autumn and Spring term.
- You may request a meeting at any time throughout the year
- You will be made aware of your child's achievement at the end of the school year in a written report.



## Settling in

- A lot of time is spent in the first few weeks doing activities designed to help the children settle into school.
- Some children take longer than others DO NOT PANIC if your child seems unsettled at the beginning.
